

Addiction can manifest in various forms, including substance abuse and behavioral addictions. Sunny Dunes Clubhouse opens our meeting spaces to a variety of recovery programs with an LGBTQ+ emphasis.

These include (but aren't limited to):

Alcoholics Anonymous (AA): Perhaps the most well-known recovery program, AA follows a 12-step approach to recovery.

Crystal Meth Anonymous (CMA): A fellowship of individuals who have come together to support each other in their recovery from addiction to crystal methamphetamine.

Co-dependents Anonymous (CoDA): A twelvestep program designed to support individuals who struggle with codependency. **Al-Anon:** Al-Anon is a worldwide fellowship that offers a program of recovery for families and friends of alcoholics.


Narcotics Anonymous (NA): A Twelve–Step fellowship of men and women for whom drugs had become a major problem. We are recovering addicts who meet regularly to help each other to stay clean.

Debtors Anonymous (DA): DA is a Twelve Step program which offers hope for people whose use of unsecured debt causes problems and suffering.

Sex and Love Addicts Anonymous (SLAA): A
Twelve Step fellowship based on the model
pioneered by AA. The only qualification for S.L.A.A.
membership is a desire to stop living out a pattern

of sex and love addiction.

Other recovery programs that meet include: Adult Children of Alcoholics & Dysfunctional Families (ACOA), Overeaters Anonymous (OA) and Workaholics Anonymous (WA).
